OUR TRUST IS IN GOD - PSALM 91:1, 2, 4

1. He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty. 2. I will say to the Lord, "My refuge and my fortress - My God in whom I trust."... 4. He will cover you with his pinions, And under his wings, You will find refuge.



To be taken 'under the wing' is a familiar concept for us today. In schools, employment, or any new situation an older, more experienced person is assigned to a younger one, to teach and to guide the newbies - to 'take them under the wing'. In Scripture, under His wings is a metaphor for God's holy presence especially as refuge for the poor and the needy in their distress, a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat of the sun. Think of the hen sheltering and protecting her chicks beneath her wings for warmth and safety from predators. Jesus applied the image to Israel in Matt 23; Lk 13: "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her. How often I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you were not willing!" Psalms 36, 57, 63 all speak of taking refuge and singing for joy "in the shadow of your wings". These are lovely images, but we see in Ps 91, a richer application of God's sheltering wings.

In some Bible versions "the shelter of the Most High" is called "the secret place" and both are associated with God's presence. Inside the wilderness tabernacle and later, in the temple there was a secret, innermost chamber where only the high priest could enter once a year to sprinkle the mercy seat with the blood of the sacrifice, as atonement for the sins of the people (Ex 28; Heb 9:7). This sacred place contained the Ark of the Covenant which was covered by the 'mercy seat' where God was 'enthroned', and His holy presence dwelled among His people (Ex 25:22; Num 7:89). Over the mercy seat the overarching wings of the cherubim touched tip to tip in the middle, hence the one at worship or prayer was 'sheltered under the shadow of God's wings' (see picture above).

The "mercy seat" for Israel, was the intersection between needy people and a loving, caring and forgiving God. Those who dwelt there were those who sins were covered and forgiven.

The Christian on the other hand is protected by the salvation of the Lord through Jesus Christ – in him we dwell forever in God's presence. We will escape death and the snare of the evil one. (Heb 2:14). Through him, we may boldly approach God's throne of grace anytime, not just once a year because Christ has done all for us that was needed to be done for salvation. Through the cross, He opened up a new and living way. We live in him and he in us. He is our dwelling place and he keeps us and guards us until that day when he comes again. Because of Christ's redeeming sacrifice, we can forever abide under his wings in the protection of His presence. Praise and thanks be to God.
