Answer me!!

Reading the first phrase of Psalm 4, "Answer me when I call to you", I think of how a child calls to a parent – Mu—um! You know whether the call for help is one of urgent action or a call that's one of a dozen in the day.

These words from David form a desperate request for help. pleading with God. Hear the emotion in the words for comfort. David is deeply distressed, and rightly so.

David is imploring God for an answer to his great sorrow over his broken relationship with his third son, Absolom who went off the rails. David can't relate positively to his son and he's deeply saddened.

Ever feel like that? Ever get desperate to find some solution to broken relationships with your children? Broken families have been in existence for all of biblical history, if we care to go to Genesis. So we can be sure that this appeal of David's is one that God's been used to.

God is listening to David's petitions. See verse 3 - "The Lord hears when I call to him."

Then David receives some answers: even though David himself wasn't a saint at times, he still trusts God as Father. That's important for us to remember. Keep faithful to God. Give God your prayers of anguish when you're at the end of your tether.

We all want the best for our children, and love them dearly, but it saddens us to see them as broken people.

God's answer to David is that, despite David's own brokenness, he is able to receive gladness in his heart, and sleep in peace. He feels safe in God's presence.

We are all broken people, but we can still trust God to hear us in times of our distress.

You and I are part of God's family, as we'll hear in the epistle of John during today's worship. We are God's children, always loved. Keep the faith, keep trusting God to hear you in your distress. We will receive peace and comfort to give us rest.. Ruth

congregation in singing". At the conclusion of the dedication we sang the hymn written by Fred Green "When in our music God is glorified"




