Dale and I are here, unpacked, sorted and ready to share ministry and life as disciples of Christ among you all at Aitkenvale Uniting! Looking forward to these next three months ... and getting to know you all!

In churches around the world that follow (as we do) the Revised Common Lectionary, today is *Good Shepherd Sunday*. Our two focus readings of Psalm 23 and John 10:11-18 point to and celebrate God as shepherd. In fact Jesus proclaims himself in John 10:10 and 14 as the "good shepherd". I'll unpack that some more in my sermon.

In both of these passages, the pastoral nature of God shines through. That word "pastoral" is interesting. We perhaps, rather than the old-worldly word "shepherd" are more used to terms like "stockman" or "grazier" or "sheep farmer".

Did you know that the word pastor and pastoral have the same origins. The word "pastor" derives from

the <u>Latin</u> noun *pastor* which means "<u>shepherd</u>". Present-day usage of the word is rooted in the <u>Biblical</u> metaphor of shepherding; being pastor of the "flock" which these days we prefer to know as the people or family of God ... the body of Christ, the church, the congregation, community in Christ.

In my all-too-short time among you, I will seek in God's strength and Spirit resources to be your pastor. Dale will be alongside me in this journey. Yet, it's my hope we'll seize the opportunity, perhaps in fresh ways, perhaps in risky ways, to be "pastor" to each other – all the while drawing our life and purposes from Christ, the good shepherd. Remember, Jesus memorably said to disciples at the Last Supper, A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." John 13:34-35 ESV

Who are the sheep in our community, in our life circles, in our day and age who Jesus is calling us to enfold into his grace ... into his loving embrace? Let's grow more and more each day into the pastoral, Christ-centred, outreaching community we're called to be at Aitkenvale UC; which we already are in so many God-blessed ways.
