#### **PRAYING FOR PEACE**

Do you see my peace lily. I've taken the risk of trying again to grow one of these lovely tropical plants. My first one died – it seems I was too liberal with the water!!! This time I know better.

Curious to learn how this plant got its name, I googled and learned that its called a peace lily



because it's flowers look like a white flag of surrender or peace. So it makes a suitable symbol for peace and tranquillity, and in some cultures is associated with funerals, sympathy and rebirth.

Today, our Advent scriptures point to God's messenger who brings peace and so our prayers for today are very specifically about peace.

When you arrived this morning you would have received a cutout paper leaf and a pen. If, as the service unfolds, you become aware of a burden to pray for peace, please write one or two words about it on your leaf. There will be an opportunity after the sermon to place the leaves around the Peace Lily on the table – where it will become one with the Prayers of Intercession.

You might feel led to pray for a person who is yet to know the ultimate peace of being reconciled to God through Christ; reconciliation in your own conflicts; nations at war, or under threat of war; for world leaders, peace-breakers, peacemakers; lost children, grieving families, devastated towns, obliterated homes, schools, businesses, incomes; for the rockets to cease, the machines of war to be silent; for our Defence Force personnel and Chaplains; for God's kingdom of peace to come on earth as in heaven. Whatever and whoever God puts on your heart... God will hear your heart.
