"Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord." Luk 19:38a

One day, as a nine-year-old primary school pupil wandering in the school yard I came across an unexpected, and to me, sight. Near the edge of a cement slab there was a piece that was lifted up. I bent down for a good look and it was a mushroom. Yes, a mushroom, a white capped mushroom had pushed right through from underneath.

I knew my mushrooms. My older brother and I, basket and kitchen knife in hand, would wander across paddocks and down grassy verges in country South Australia each autumn and spring looking for mushrooms. It was a happy day to take half a basket home. Mushrooms on buttery toast were a delicacy for us. In good seasons we set up a roadside stall and sold them, two shillings for a brown paper bag full.

Well, I was amazed and wonderstruck finding this fragile earthy product monstering up the cement. You had to look after them, no fast running or bouncing around lest they break up and get smashed. So easy to crush in your hand and yet, a wonderful strength in its growth. This memory came back this week and, as you do, I googled "mushroom breaks through concrete", and there was a post on *Reddit* where someone had a photo of a mushroom pushing up through an asphalt path in a local path [I can't show you because of copyright law]. Well, I did find a scientific explanation for this phenomenon, but for me it was still mysterious and filled me with awe.

And so, we come to the gospel story. Jesus enters Jerusalem for the last time Now the excitement and anxiety of the people intensified. Jesus and his followers were heading for a showdown with the authorities; the Jewish religious authorities and ultimately the Roman civil authorities. This account comprises a powerful declaration. Jesus doesn't stand up and preach, but the very action itself tells us again the nature of God's reign. There was no armed revolt, as the Maccabees had commanded two hundred years previously; but we might imagine a such an uprising where the leader on his charger rallied the followers. He holds his sword high and calls for a fight, and his troopers wave their weapons in fury, hungry for the battle.

No, Jesus goes forward riding a sluggish beast of burden. There are excited people shouting loudly, but not for war. They are waving their arms, their hands do not hold weapons, but palm fronds. For those who wanted Jesus to lead a revolt against Roman invaders, it seemed ludicrous, laughable. But Jesus rides on. The people proclaim him "King". But Jesus did not look like most kings of the world. There is his humility and vulnerability and yet a real strength that does not avoid the confrontation. This is God-strength, love pursuing peace with justice to the end. So, the mushroom is a metaphor, the fragile thing, pushing through with unexpected and unrelenting strength. And this is us.
